Local governments are legally mandated by the Province to have emergency management programs. They are often viewed as responsible for most emergency planning and preparedness in communities. You can make a request for your CF to have representation on your local Emergency Planning Committee, Emergency Management Committee, or Emergency Management Working Groups. Contact RRI to "speak their language" to position your CF to support your region's emergency management mandate and legal obligations.
